Masking

As of March 14, 2022 we have made face coverings optional - following the CDC guidelines that they are not necessary when there is low community spread. We anticipate that masks will again be

- 1. High community spread in Fulton County, or
- 2. High community spread at a campus or a classroom.

We are specifying that masks are optional for children and vaccinated adults. As of right now, we are continuing to require all unvaccinated adults to wear masks in our school. The primary reason I moderate to high community transmission levels).

Classroom Clasuras

In the communication we received last week from Georgia Childcare Association, they specified that Georgia Department of Health, Bright from the Start, and the Governor's staff have indicated the institute more lenient or stringent policies as they deem appropriate. The only requirement for all Georgians (not just early learning/child care centers) is to adhere to the provision or our administra

We are in a new phase with COVID19 and in determining whether and whom to exclude when an exposure occurs. Here are some factors/considerations that will guide our decision making:

- 1. Since our inception, we have dealt with contagious illnesses in classrooms and have had to address concerns of community spread. We will always report them, and prior to COVID19, we never
- 2. We would anticipate a similar approach for COVID19, however, there may be situations where we feel it is in the best interest of the community to do so. Some examples of this could be multip necessary.

If we decide to keep a classroom open after a member of the classroom has COVID and was present, we will most likely ask any one coming into the classroom who is not vaccinated to take a COVII

Holiday Weekends/Travel/Parties, Etc:

We ask that all community members continue to exercise good judgment and take the proper precautions when in group settings or when traveling. COVID19 is not over, but we do recognize that li

Commingling Classrooms:

For the time being, we are going to continue with our strategy to segregate classrooms since this has worked to contain community spread. We believe it is too much change to start commingling c

Tuition During Classroom Closures:

As before, if there is a classroom exposure and the school requires an exclusion, we will offer a tuition break as outlined here. If a family decides to quarantine and the classroom is open, there is no

During the next few weeks and months we ask that you continue and safety of our community, recognizing that parents need a consistent school environment for their child(ren), and our teachers (and children) need and want to stay healthy!
